Questions and Answers

There were several questions raised by residents:

Q: Is there any concern that frisbees hitting the fruit trees could damage them or cause the fruit to fall off?
A: No. You'd have to throw a frisbee extremely hard for it to cause any damage to a tree. There's little to no chance of that occurring.

Q: Was there any other location within Hidden Springs considered for the Disc Golf Course because the installation of the equipment in the orchard will destroy the peace, calm, and beauty of the entrance to the community. A resident would not be permitted to install anything that looks like the Disc Golf goals on our property according to the design standards and CC&Rs, so HSTA should not be installing something like this, which will detract from the beauty of the community's front door/lawn.

A: We considered the creek bottom, but it posed problems that made the idea unworkable. We are going through the approval process any resident would have to go through to make changes to their property – the Design Review and Open Space Committees have given their approval so far.

Q: How will noise generated by the Disc Golf Course be managed – loud radios, people drinking alcohol and getting loud, etc. A: All those things can occur currently (without the Course being there), but they don't as far as we know. A Disc Golf Couse won't generate these types of issues: there won't be that much traffic and the Disc Golf community is respectful.

Q: How can the potential for fire on the dry grass hillside adjacent to the course be mitigated – someone playing the course of throwing down their cigarette can cause a fast-moving fire, which can sweep up the hill to the homes on Town Ridge? That's a very valid question. Perhaps HSTA can install sprinklers that can be used (reuse water) in the event of a fire. This can be explored. HS residents are fire-wise, so are careful concerning fire issues.
